## Notes from Faculty Senate & University Governance

As of this academic year, ASAC now has representation on Faculty Senate and University Governance. Here are some updates on what's going on at Faculty Senate:

**Academic Governance: Proposed Policy Changes** 

Good Status and Emeritus Policy. Currently, Emeritus status is automatically granted at the time of one's retirement from MSU (the benefits include use of the library, free parking on campus, and invitation to ceremonial events). However, the University Committee for Faculty Affairs would like to revise this policy to:

- Allow emeritus status to be granted to faculty and academic staff who end their employment at MSU after a substantial period of distinguished service short of the years needed for retirement eligibility, upon the recommendation of the Provost to the President, after consultation with the University Committee for Faculty Affairs.
- Add to spirit of current policy that emeritus is granted automatically upon retirement assuming good standing. Good Standing is assumed unless one ends employment while suspended or during termination proceedings.
- Allow for the revocation of emeritus status upon the recommendation of the Provost to the
  President, after consultation with the University Committee for Faculty Affairs, in those
  exceptional cases in which behavior occurring or discovered after being awarded emeritus
  status is deemed to be substantially inconsistent with the behavior expected of MSU faculty and
  academic staff.


**Appointed Positions:** any functional area can be appointed (Advising, Teaching, Outreach, Curriculum Development, Research) and appointed officers serve a 3-year term.

The committee only meets during the academic year and it is understood that those with fixed-term appointments may not be able to complete a full-term, but that's okay!

All nominees will appear on the ballot, and the election committee will determine its layout.



Why you should know your Academic Specialist Handbook: **Raises for Promotion** 



# Make sure to also consult members of your unit-- as each unit may handle promotion and advancement differently!

The Specialist Handbook provides a brief overview of promotion as covered in the last ASAC newsletter but does not detail raises as a result of promotion. In <u>Appendix A</u> of the handbook the basic requirements for promotion in the specialist system are mentioned.

# However, in recent years, Academic HR and the Provost's office now provide for a raise for Academic Specialist's promotion:

Central Support for Promotions Central support for promotional increments for tenure system faculty will be provided in 2018-19 at \$2,000 per promotion from Assistant to Associate Professor and at \$2,500 per promotion from Associate to Professor. For those appointed at the associate professor rank but without tenure, \$2,000 will be provided upon receipt of tenure. Promotional increases for Librarians will be recognized with central support of \$2,000; \$2,000 will be provided for the promotions of Senior Academic Specialists, continuing NSCL staff, and continuing Academic Specialists. The promotional increments are to be effective October 1, 2018. If unit promotional policy exceeds the above funding, units are responsible for funding such increases through the raise list. Raise control figures may be exceeded by the amounts centrally provided for promotional increments.
